



Interclub Events Policy

IGC provides opportunities for members to participate in Interclub Events with Reciprocal Clubs and other local clubs.

This Policy outlines the processes for classification and management of Interclub Events and the selection and participation of IGC teams in those events.

Oversight of this Policy is the responsibility of the Match Committee.

POLICY

Classification of Events:

Inter Club Events are to be classified as either:

- Official Interclub Events, or
- Member-Led Interclub Social Events.

Current Official Interclub Events List

Men's:

- Claiming Cup (Brisbane)

Women's:

- Brisbane exchange
- Royal Queensland exchange
- Sanctuary Cove exchange

Official Interclub Event Arrangements

- Each event is to be co-ordinated between the management of the two participating clubs with oversight from the Club Captain/Women's Captain as appropriate.
- All event arrangements – Golf, F&B, trophies, other prizes etc – are organised and delivered by the host club utilising the host club's facilities.
- Club officials – Board and Management – are likely to participate in the Official Interclub Events and will play hosting roles when IGC is hosting the event.
- Participation in the IGC team will be open to all IGC members via an expression of interest process with teams selected either :
 - by the Captain or Women's Captain and Golf Ops Manager, or

- on a first come first served basis

as outlined in the expression of interest.

- Costs of the event, both to participants and to the club, are co-ordinated between the participating clubs directly. Players in all current official interclub events are not charged green fees of any kind but do pay a fee for food and beverage.
- Official Interclub Events will appear of the IGC annual golf calendar.

Current Member-Led Interclub Social Events List

Men's:

- Hit Up Cup (Southport)
- Millenium Cup (Royal Queensland)
- Pymble exchange

Member-Led Interclub Social Events Arrangements

- Each event is to be organised by individual members or groups of members with no direct involvement from the club.
- Participation is through invitation from the organising member/s.
- All costs and the format of the event are determined by the organising member/s.
- IGC's only involvement is to engage with the organising member/s to find suitable dates for the event if being played at IGC (i.e. timeslot availability) and to respond to any other needs of the event as requested by the organising member/s (e.g. function room availability, food and beverage arrangements).
- The club will make every effort to accommodate these events, however, is under no obligation to do so.
- If the event is being held with a reciprocal club, all visiting players will be afforded the privileges due to them under their reciprocal arrangement. visiting players will be charged the member's guest rate for their golf (assuming there are at least as many IGC members playing as guests). However, the club always has the option to waive such visitor fees if it is deemed to be in the club's best interests (e.g. Millenium Cup players do not pay green fees at either club).
- The organising member/s are free to make whatever arrangements they wish for the event, but if they choose to utilise the club's facilities, all costs will be charged at standard member rates and IGC will act in accordance with the club's policies on all matters (e.g. RSA policy, Golf Cart policy, etc).
- Club Officials – Board and Management – may participate in these events if invited by the organising member/s but are under no obligation to do so.
- These events will not appear on the IGC annual golf calendar.

- Any proposal to create a new Official Interclub Event will require approval by the Board.
